

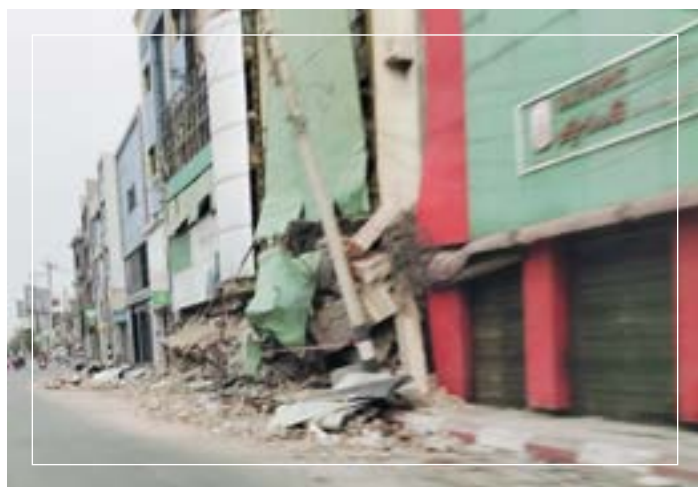


TURNING DESPAIR INTO HOPE IN MYANMAR, ONE LIFE AT A TIME

Dear Friend,

The crisis in Myanmar is far from over.

Despair hangs in the air like thick smoke. The country—already crushed by four years of civil war, brutal authoritarian rule, and complete neglect by those in power—was shaken to its core after the catastrophic 7.7 earthquake.



As you read this, families are still living in the open air. Sidewalks, parks, and any open space have become makeshift camps. Parents continue to search through rubble with their bare hands, not for possessions—but for their children's bodies.

This is not just a humanitarian crisis. It is a spiritual crisis. And the Church in Myanmar—small, faithful, and battered—is crying out for help.

Shortly after the earthquake, I received this urgent message from Pastor Paul in Mandalay, the city hit hardest by the disaster:

“Many Christians and other families are suffering and in desperate need of food, water and temporary shelter. Please help!”

Thank you from the bottom of my heart to everyone who responded to my urgent email for emergency aid to Pastor Paul for the victims of this devastating earthquake. Your quick response enabled us to get life-saving food, water, and shelter to families in desperate need. **THANK YOU!**

Sadly, much of the world has looked away. But as Christians, we cannot.

Outside a collapsed hotel in Mandalay, one mother, Nan, stood outside for five long days, hoping her son might be found, said:

"I'm very distressed. I'm holding on just hoping to see my son's face. Whether he's dead or alive, I just want to see his body."

Her pain echoes the heartbreak of a nation—uncertain, aching, and alone.

Yet amidst the chaos, the Church still stands.

Pastor Paul and local believers are doing all they can—distributing food, sharing water, and praying with the broken-hearted. But with few resources and too few hands, they cannot do it alone. **This is where you come in.**

Daw, a mother who lost everything in the quake, shared these words:
